

Recognition

The first recognized remains of Neandertal were found in 1856 by a German road crew in the 'Neander Valley'. A local school teacher, Johan C. Fuhlrott recognized the bones as being unusual and of special interest.



The 'Neander Valley' (Neandertal in German) is surrounded by the four cities of Mettmann in the north, Erkrath in the east, Gruiten in the west and Vohwinkel in the south.
